+Partita on "Veni Creator Spiritus" (Come, Creator Spirit) is a highly condensed, yet varied and colorful treatment of the Pentecost chant. The work is built on selected portions of the chant tune, setting them in short contrasting movements. The first phrase is set several times, first as a free introductory recitative, and then as a chorale. The Bicinium is a bright, unpredictable yet playful duo for two keyboards. The Aria which follows is a darker, more mysterious and modal treatment of the melody, reminiscent of the cantus firmus chorale preludes of J.S. Bach. Finally, the Hocket (a medieval musical form meant to sound like a hiccup) moves contrapuntally into a rhapsodic pedal cadenza, and then on to the final brief toccata where the entire unaltered melody may be heard prominently stated in the pedal. ~MBB
